Talk about the Classroom and School Life, Discuss Everyday Activities, Ask Questions in Spanish, Describe the Location of People and Things. Present Tense of -AR Verbs. Present Tense of ESTAR. Numbers 31 and Higher. Culture: Secondary School in the Spanish Speaking World

Lección 3

Talk about Family and Friends, Describe People and Things, Express Possession. Descriptive Adjectives and Possessive Adjectives. Present Tense of -ER and -IR Verbs. PResent Tense of TENER and VENIR. Culture: Surnames and families in the Spanish Speaking World, Spain's Royal Family

Grading Policy

This class is designed to have students complete work in a timely manner. The design of the VHL system makes it easier to complete work during class, and if necessary as homework. In the second quarter, students will be expected to do speaking assignments individually and in groups. Some assignments will require the student to record speaking on the VHL system. Some projects will also have an option to either record a video or complete a presentation in class.

Should homework not be submitted by the deadline, there is an automatic 5% deduction per day.

Quizzes will be given at minimum twice during a unit, and over any significant material such as verb conjugations. Tests are after each unit. Semester projects are once a semester.
