Bellevue Elementary Update

Driving near the Bellevue MS/HS last week, and early this week, you may have noticed work being done in the field to the east. It is the beginning of the process for the new Bellevue Elementary School as we are drilling a Geothermal test well for the new building. Ground breaking for the building will likely be occurring in March of 2024 after the plans for the building are finalized and the building is "put out for bid" to contractors.



Safe Environments and Emergency Notifications

<u>Safe Environments</u> - The district works to maintain a safe environment for students and staff, this includes the physical entrances to the buildings, rules and regulations within the schools, and specific behaviors and expectations for students in our system overall. The district has enhanced safeguards in our schools over the last few years, and will continue training for staff (and students) during this school year.

The district also wants to issue that the environment in the schools is safe for our students. As a result, periodically, in conjunction with law enforcement officials the school district will conduct K-9 maintenance searches. Student lockers, desks, the parking lot, and other storage areas owned by the school district and used by students can and will be inspected. Student bags may also be placed in hallways or common areas and searched by K-9 units as well. Trained law enforcement officials will conduct these inspections.

Emergency Notifications - Emergency notifications, including weather-related announcements and other potential emergency situations, are shared in a variety of ways. Information will be shared via our JMC Student Management System via email and text, along with being posted on social media areas and local TV and radio outlets. A summary of the areas is below:

- Email and Text All parents (primary contact) who have shared a valid email address and cell number will be notified via email and text of weather-related late starts, early dismissals, and days with no school.
- Social media Facebook Tom Meyer on Facebook and TomMeyerBHS on Twitter ("X")
- Radio and TV Dubuque and Maquoketa radio stations and area local TV stations

Additionally, any other school emergencies will also be communicated to parents in the same manner with regular updates. This would include any threatening situations to the school and its students.

While I have the dates and times listed for the Fall Parent-Teacher Conferences on the side of the document, I want to remind everyone of the process, along with the new times for this school year.


