Safe Environments

The district works to maintain a safe environment for students and staff, this includes the physical entrances to the buildings, rules and regulations within the schools, and specific behaviors and expectations for students in our system overall. The district has enhanced safeguards in our schools this school year, and will continue training for our staff (and students) during this school year.

The district also wants to assure that the environment in the schools is safe for our students. As a result, periodically, in conjunction with law enforcement officials the school district will conduct K-9 maintenance searches. Student lockers, desks, the parking lot, and other storage areas owned by the school district and used by students can and will be inspected. Student bags may also be placed in hallways or common areas and searched by K-9 units as well. Trained law enforcement officials will conduct these inspections.



Bellevue Wrestling

It's that time of year again. Wrestling season. I would like to invite your family to check out our youth wrestling program at Bellevue Community Schools. This will be our eleventh season of offering our successful Shooting Stars practices. Our program has seen some extraordinary success during this time: seventeen AAU state tournament qualifiers with four state place winners, 2020 champion, Casey Tath.

Come and join us on October 31 as we start our newest season. Our goals for your child will be to learn self-confidence, how to deal with adversity, provide additional physical activity, and develop some basic skills in the sport of wrestling. As always, participation is free! Many programs in our area charge up to \$60 for membership, but we are committed to creating a total program for our sport and we believe it begins with our youth program, not paying numerous fees to participate.

Wrestling is not just for boys. Currently girls wrestling is one of the fastest growing sports in the state of Iowa and the rest of the country. With the IGHSAU sanctioning of girls wrestling for championship status, and the University of Iowa adding women's wrestling in 2023, we want our Bellevue girls to be able to compete with other girls from across the state in a safe and welcoming environment. In addition to regular practices on Monday nights, we will offer a girls only session on Tuesday nights for your daughters in K-6th grade.

Instruction will be led by the high school coaching staff, including David Ripperger. Coach Ripperger has been involved with wrestling for over 40 years and brings nearly 30 years of coaching experience to Bellevue. Members of the high school team will also be sharing their knowledge of this great sport with your youngsters.

Practice will be Monday and Tuesday nights. All practices will take in the Bellevue Wrestling room located at the high school. Each practice will last one hour:

Monday Nights open to all wrestlers (boys and girls)

- Instruction this night will include technique of the week and drilling with games.
- K through 2nd grade only will meet 6 pm to 7 pm
- 3rd through 6th grade only will meet 7 pm to 8 pm

Tuesday Nights more intense training (optional)

- Girls only will meet from 6 pm to 7 pm
- Bellevue Elite for $3^{\rm rd}$ through $6^{\rm th}$ graders who show more interest in the sport and want additional practice time with more emphasis on live wrestling

All your student needs to bring is athletic clothing, non-street shoes or wrestling shoes, and a willingness to learn. We do ask that all parents bring in any old singlets and shoes that no longer fit for the first practice. We can use this opportunity for an equipment swap.
